ESF's priorities and values are shaped through engagement with the worldwide community of Esperanto speakers, as well as with researchers, educators and activists in many language-related fields.



ESF's priorities revolve around three main areas:

> **Research:** ESF works to encourage and facilitate scholarship and public discourse on interlingual communication and interlinguistics, linguistic justice, language policy and planning, and the phenomenon of Esperanto.

> **Conservation:** ESF works with libraries, organisations and individuals to preserve valuable documents, artifacts and objects that bear witness to the rich history of the phenomenon of Esperanto and the broader field of interlinguistics in general.

> **Education:** ESF encourages the study and teaching of Esperanto and interlinguistics specifically at university level, offering support for residential and online courses, and support for the creation and maintenance of online educational resources.
